Authors should submit at www.easychair.org/conferences/?conf=cpm09 an extended abstract not exceeding 10 single-spaced pages on A4 (or US letter) paper, including references, figures, title, authors, affiliations, e-mail addresses, and a short (one paragraph) abstract. Please use the LATEX style file supplied by Springer Verlag for Lecture Notes in Computer Science (www.springer.de/comp/lncs/authors.html). Final proceedings papers must be camera-ready in this format.
